Eligibility – All classes and divisions are open to any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. All Thoroughbreds must have T.I.P. numbers on entry form. www.tjctip.com

Junior – Junior classes and divisions are open to riders under 18 years of age as of 12/18

Junior/Young Rider (applies to Dressage classes only) – Junior/Young rider classes are open to riders under 22 years of age as of 12/1/18

Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division competed in as horse-and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday.

Class Numbers: 2'6" (#109A), 2'9" (#109B) and 3'0" (#109C)

110. Open Hunter Derby – Open to all Thoroughbreds and riders who have shown in at least two (2) hunter or equitation classes at the show (warm-up classes excluded). Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division competed in as horse-and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday.

Class Numbers: 2'6" (#110A), 2'9" (#110B) and 3'0" (#110C)

309. Chizzy B Hunter Classic – Riders must have shown in at least two (2) hunter or equitation classes at the show (warm-up classes excluded). Exhibitor's fence height to be determined by the highest division competed in as a horse- and-rider combination on Friday or Saturday. The class is a two-round format. The top 15 scores will return for a second round; final placings will be determined by the culmination of both scores. The class will be conducted using three fence heights, but it will be pinned as one class. There is no jog. Equitation 12 and Under – Open to any rider age 12 and under riding a Thoroughbred. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'0". Fence height 2'0". **Classes: 312, 313**

Open 2'3" Equitation – Open to any Junior and Adult Amateur riders on a Thoroughbred. Riders not eligible to jump over 2'3". Fence height 2'3". **Classes: 314, 315**

Intermediate Child/Adult Equitation 2'6" – Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider on a Thoroughbred. Fence height 2'6". Classes: 316, 317

2'9" Equitation – Open to any Junior or Adult Amateur rider on a Thoroughbred. Fence height 2'9". **Classes: 318, 319**

Stonelea Ring (Halter, Pleasure & Western)

400. Fresh Off the Track Walk/Trot – Open to Thoroughbreds that raced in 2019. Judged on manners and way of going at the walk and trot. Horses not eligible to jump over 2'0".

401. Senior English Pleasure Division – Open to any Thoroughbred. Judged on manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter. Division consists of a W/T and W/T/C class. Judge will evaluate turnout and may inquire as to race history, with minor blemishes and faults not considered. Horses not eligible to jump over 2'0".

402. Junior English Pleasure Division – Open to any Thoroughbred. Judged on manners and way of going at the walk, trot and canter. Judge will evaluate turnout and may inquire as to race history, with minor blemishes and faults not considered. Horses not eligible to jump over 2'0".

403. Showmanship – Open to any Thoroughbred. Horses to be shown in well- fitted halter or bridle. Will perform a set pattern to be posted at least one hour before the class commences. The class is based on exhibitor's ability to fit and present a horse, as well as on his or her ability to quickly and efficiently perform the pattern.

404/414. Walk/Trot Division – Open to any Thoroughbred. Horses to be shown at the walk and trot. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance. Consists of three classes: Walk/Trot Pleasure, Walk/Trot Equitation and Walk/Trot Hunter Hack, where horses will be asked to individually jump two crossrails set in a line. Fence height: 18". Horses not eligible to jump over 2'0".

405/415. Walk/Trot/Canter Division – Open to any Thoroughbred. Horses tobe shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance. Consists of three classes: Walk/Trot/Canter Pleasure, Walk/Trot/Canter Equitation and Walk/Trot/Canter Hunter Hack, where horses

Division 420 is three classes: Walk/Jog (420A), Walk/Jog/Lope (420B) and Western Ranch Rail (420C). Division may also be judged on turnout. Open to any Thoroughbred. Riders may ride one- or two-handed on any bridle. Western tack is required. ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn in the Junior Division.

Western Walk/Jog – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and jog. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. To be judged on the horse's obedience and suitability as a pleasure mount.

Western Walk/Jog/Lope – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog and lope. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. Judged on the Western horse's way of going and manners at the walk, jog, and lope.

Western Horsemanship (Friday only) – Open to any Thoroughbred. To be shown at walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring. Riders will also be asked to ride a set pattern, which will be posted at least one hour before the class commences. Class to be judged on rider's ability to execute the pattern smoothly with correct body position. Western Ranch Rail (Saturday only) – Open to any Thoroughbred. To be shown individually at the walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. Horses may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

407/421. Western Division Senior - Division 407 is three classes: Walk/Jog (407A), Walk/Jog/Lope (407B) and Western Horsemanship W/J/L (407C). **Division 421** is three classes: Walk/Jog (421A), Walk/Jog/Lope (421B) and Western Ranch Rail (421C). Division may also be judged on turnout. Open to any Thoroughbred. Riders may ride one- or two-handed on any bridle. Western tack is required. Western headgear permitted in Senior Division on adults over the age of 18 only. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty in the Senior Division by adults over the age of 18.

Western Walk/Jog – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and jog. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. To be judged on the horse's obedience and suitability as a pleasure mount.

Western Walk/Jog/Lope – To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog and lope. May be asked to back per judge's discretion. Judged on the Western horse's way of going and manners at the

walk, jog, and lope.

Western Horsemanship (Friday only) – Open to any Thoroughbred. To be shown at walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring. Riders will also be asked to ride a set pattern, which will be posted at least one hour before the class commences. Class to be judged on rider's ability to execute the pattern smoothly with correct body position. Western Ranch Rail (Saturday only) – Open to any Thoroughbred. To be shown individually at the walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. Horses may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

408. War Horse In-Hand – Open to Thoroughbreds that have raced at least 50 times OR that have won over \$100,000. Will be judged on conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. Race record details must be provided to the show secretary. Horses to be judged Saturday at 7:30 AM. Placed horse's statistics will be announced. Cannot cross enter with In-Hand Classes. Minor blemishes and faults not considered. Horse should be presented in a bridle.

409. Leadline – Open to children 6 years of age and under riding Thoroughbreds. Riders will be judged on horsemanship, hands, seat, legs and position.

410. In-Hand Mares – Thoroughbred mares to be presented in-hand in a bridle. Mares will be asked to walk and trot, and will be judged on conformation and way of going.

411. In-Hand Geldings – Thoroughbred geldings to be presented in-hand in a bridle. Geldings will be asked to walk and trot, and will be judged on conformation and way of going.

412. Western-Type Halter – Thoroughbreds to be presented in-hand in a halter. Horses will be asked to walk and jog, and will be judged on conformation and way of going as a western-type horse.

413. Adopted Horse English Pleasure W/T/C or W/J/L - Open to Thoroughbreds that have been adopted thorough an adoption program. Proof of adoption is required. To be judged on way of going at a walk, trot and canter under English tack or walk, jog, lope under western tack. Horses can cross-enter into other Pleasure classes. Sponsored by the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance. Winner of the class will receive a TAA gift bag.

416. W/T Equitation Junior – Open to any Junior rider riding a Thoroughbred to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot.

- **417. W/T/C Equitation Junior** Open to any Junior rider riding a Thoroughbred to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter.
- **418. W/T Equitation Senior** Open to any Adult Amateur rider riding a Thoroughbred to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and trot.
- **419. W/T/C Equitation Senior** Open to any Adult Amateur rider riding a Thoroughbred to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, trot and canter.
- **422.** Ranch Riding Open to any Thoroughbred. Horses to be ridden in Western tack. To be shown individually in a pattern, which will be posted at least one hour before the class commences. Class to be judged on the precision of pattern maneuvers and horse's movement. Pattern may include sidepassing, extended trot, extended lope, lead changes, spins or riding over natural obstacles such as logs.
- **423. Trail** Open to any Thoroughbred. Horses may be presented in English or Western tack. To be shown individually in a pattern, which will be posted at least one hour before the class commences. RRP Alumni 2016 High Point Thoroughbred Award will be given to the Thoroughbred that competed in the 2016 RRP Makeover accumulating the most points in New Vocations Horse Show classes; two divisions: Dressage/Western Dressage and all other classes.

RRP Alumni 2013-15 High Point Thoroughbred Award will be given to the Thoroughbred that competed in the 2013 - 2015 RRP Makeovers

accumulating the most points in New Vocations Horse Show classes; two divisions: Dressage/Western Dressage and all other classes.

Information: A ribbon and prize provided by RRP will be awarded for each RRP high point award. To be eligible, Thoroughbred Information Form must be submitted with entry indicating horse's RRP status. All statuses will be confirmed by RRP.

T.I.P. CHAMPIONSHIPS SPECIFICATIONS

Horse Eligibility – To qualify for the Championships, a Thoroughbred must participate in a show offering T.I.P. high point awards, classes or divisions in the applicable discipline between August 1, 2018, and July 31, 2019, have participated in the 2018 T.I.P. Performance Awards in the applicable discipline or have been accepted through a hardship request. Owners and riders must declare their horse for the Championships by submitting a Horse Declaration Form. Each horse may only be entered in one (1) Championship Division. For hunters and jumpers, the horse must be entered at or above the lowest height jumped during the Championship year. For dressage, each horse may enter at or above the lowest level competed in during the Championship year. For Dressage, each horse may entered at or above the lowest level competed during the Championship year. Cross entering is not permitted. A "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by TJC.

Junior – Junior classes and divisions are open to riders under 18 years of age as of 12/18

Junior/Young Rider (applies to Dressage classes only) – Junior/Young rider classes are open to riders under 22 years of age as of 12/1/18

ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn in the Junior Division. Riders may ride one- or two-handed on any bridle. To be judged on the horse's way of going, obedience and suitability as a Western Pleasure mount. Classes:

- **Western W/J** To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk and the jog.
- **Western W/J/L** To be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, jog and lope.
- **Western Ranch Rail** Open to any Thoroughbred. To be shown individually at the walk, jog and lope both directions of the ring. Horses may be asked to back. To be judged on manners, suitability of horse to rider and performance.

<u>Dressage Ride Times</u> – Provisional ride times will be posted by the Tuesday before the show at <u>www.newvocations.org/kentucky-charity-thoroughbred-show</u>, <u>www.tjctip.com</u>, or emailed if email address is provided. Final ride times will be posted in the show office by noon the day before the competition.

Other Information

<u>Awards Ceremony</u> – Awards will be presented in a Winner's Circle. Location of Winner's Circles will be posted in the show office along with schedule of awards.

<u>Prize Money</u> – All prize money won at the Championships will be mailed to the winner following the event. Prize money certificates will be included in division placement bags or can be picked up from the show office. Leave all completed prize money certificates with the show secretary or mail it after the show to The Jockey Club T.I.P., 821 Corporate Dr., Lexington, KY 40503.

Rules - All rules of the New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Show

will apply. Dressage Show will be conducted under 2019 USEF Dressage and USEF Western Dressage rules unless otherwise noted by show management or in these rules.

<u>Entries</u> – Entry Fee is \$50 per class. Entries must be postmarked on or before August 15, 2019. Entries are taken on a first come/first served basis until the show is full or the closing date, whichever comes first. ENTRIES LIMITED. A waiting list will be held.

<u>Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Awards</u> – The TAA will award 4 high point awards to the highest placing Thoroughbred adopted from a TAA accredited organization at the T.I.P. Championships. RULES

- 1. Classes and divisions are open to Thoroughbreds only. A "Thoroughbred" is a Thoroughbred that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. All Thoroughbreds must have T.I.P. numbers on entry form. www.tjctip.com
- 2. Show management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel or move classes and divisions as entries warrant, which could mean divisions may change days on which they run or rings in which they are held. Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the show office.
- 3. All horses entering Kentucky Horse Park grounds must have:
 - a. Valid proof of negative Coggins (within the last 12 months).
 - b. Certificate of veterinary inspection:
 - i. Horses arriving from outside the state of Kentucky must have a 30-day CVI.
 - ii. Kentucky-based horses must have a CVI within the last 12 months.

Horses that fail to arrive with appropriate paperwork will not be allowed to unload on Park grounds.

The Kentucky Horse Park requires that all horses be treated in a humane manner in accordance with various state and local humane society guidelines. Show management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Show and the Thoroughbred Incentive Program Championships.

- 4. Proper attire please.
- 5. Unless otherwise permitted while participating in the competition as indicated in a Western Pleasure Division description, ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn while mounted at all times. All riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times, even in Western classes.

- 6. No martingales permitted in flat classes.
- 7. No equine wraps or bell boots of any kind permitted in hunter or inhand classes.
- 8. Braiding not required.
- 9. The Kentucky Horse Park requires horse trailer day passes for each horse at the show that does not have a stall. Exhibitors will pay a fee of \$30 per entry as a trailer-in fee to be paid to the horse show. All trailers must park in approved lot. A special parking area will be designated and all day shippers must check in at the office immediately upon arrival at the Horse Park.
- 10. Entries for classes will be refunded upon presentation of a vet certificate pronouncing the horse unfit to show. If a horse is deemed unfit to show, the stall and administration fees will not be refunded and that entry will endure a scratch fee of \$30.
- 11. Ribbons 1st 10th place for all hunter, jumper, equitation and pleasure classes and Ribbons 1st 6th place for all Dressage classes unless otherwise noted. New Vocations Show Prizes awarded to Champion, RRP High Point winners and stand-alone class winners (except for warm-up classes). See Championship specifications for Championship awards.

Dressage will be conducted under 2019 USEF Dressage and USEF Western Dressage rules unless otherwise noted by show management or in these Rules. Whips are not permitted in Championships classes. All tests may be read. Horses can be shown in only two consecutive levels. (Example – Intro and Training Level or Training and First Level, etc., includes eventing Test equivalents as follows: BN and N (Training), T (1st level), P (2nd level), I (3rd level), A (4th level)). Horses are limited to a maximum of three (3) dressage rides per day.

- 12. Drugs and Medication Horses entered into the New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Horse Show and/or the T.I.P. Championships are subject to and must comply with the current USEF Guidelines for Drugs and Medication (Link) and are subject to drug testing. A Medication Report Form (available in the show office) must be filed in the show office documenting the therapeutic use of a forbidden substance. Violations and positive drug testing results will be cause for elimination from future New Vocations and/or T.I.P. events. Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses.
- 13. KENTUCKY HORSE PARK REGULATIONS In compliance with the

State of Kentucky Fire Code, the following are no longer allowed in stalls or barns:

- any 2-pronged plug electrical appliance (fans)
- any 2-prong plug extension cords
- light-duty cords designed for indoor use only
- any 3-way adapters unless specifically designed for outdoor use
- any adapters without 3-prong connection
- 14. Both shows REQUIRE PRE-ENTRY. All horse show entry forms must be postmarked no later than August 15. All entries must be signed by the rider (parent or guardian if rider is under 18 years of age), owner and trainer. All entries must include an OPEN CHECK (e.g. a signed check made out to New Vocations without an amount filled in). NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 15. PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT New Vocations Racehorse Adoption Program and The Jockey Club expect appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any New Vocations and/or The Jockey Club event. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or persecute others before, during or following New Vocations or The Jockey Club activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Reports of inappropriate code of conduct may be made at any time to the Show Manager via email, text, phone call or in-person (330 518 9001). Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, show staff, show volunteer or Kentucky Horse Park staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Persons found by show management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show, will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions, and will be ineligible to show at the T.I.P. Championships.
- **16.** Additional Thoroughbred Awards To be considered for ANY Thoroughbred award, the Thoroughbred Information Form must be mailed with entry. Awards will be given at the conclusion of the War Horse In-Hand class on Saturday morning in the Stonlea Ring.
- 17. Back Number REQUIRED to school at all times.
- 18. All Jumper Stake and Low Jumper Stake competitors must declare intent to participate in the show office by 12 PM on Friday, Sept. 6. A draw for the order of go will take place and riders will be assigned an

- order, which will be posted in the show office by 4 p.m. on Friday.
- 19. All Hunter Derby competitors must declare intent to participate in the show office by 12 PM on Saturday, Sept. 7. A draw for the order of go will take place and riders will be assigned an order, which will be posted in the show office by 3 PM on Saturday.
- 20. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management, whose decision shall be final.
- 21. All mounted competitors must use the horse paths do not hack on the road AT ANY TIME. Mounted competitors walking on the road will be ticketed and fined.
- 22. New Vocations All-Thoroughbred Charity Show champion and high point calculations.

24. Hunter/Jumper scratches – All scratches and adds must be made in the horse show office prior to the start of the class or the class fee will be assessed.

INFORMATION

Stabling - The Kentucky Horse Park offers 10' x 12' permanent wood box stalls. The stall fee is \$140 for three nights. Stalls will be available Thursday, Sept. 5 and must be vacated by 7 a.m. Monday, Sept. 9.

Early arrivals and late departures must notify Sarah Coleman (sarah@horseadoption.com) and pay all appropriate early arrival/late departure stall fees. Early arrivals and late departures must be indicated on your entry and incur a fee of \$50 per night per stall (including tack stalls).

Bedding is NOT provided. Please bring your own bedding or purchase on Park grounds.

Setting up or bedding a stall prior to 9 a.m. on Thursday will be charged an early arrival fee, whether occupied by a horse or not. Horses staying after 7 a.m. on Monday will be charged a late-departure fee.

Tack Stalls must be indicated on your entry and incur the stall fee of \$140 and an additional fee of \$50 per night for early arrival or late departures. Tack stalls fees cannot be split.

All stalls will be secured. If your stall security is broken prior to your paid arrival date, you will be charged an early arrival stall fee of \$50 per day. The stalls are monitored daily by the KHP and show management. Setting up your stalls prior to horses arriving does get charged by the KHP as a stall being used, therefore, show management will have to bill you an early arrival stall fee.

Moving or changing of any horse or tack stall without prior approval of the show secretary may incur a \$50 penalty.

Golf Carts – The ability to have a golf cart is a privilege, not a right. All drivers of golf carts must be 16 years old and possess a valid driver's license. No golf carts are permitted in tourist areas of the Park. Golf carts

must obey traffic laws and posted speed limits. The Kentucky Horse Park does not allow four-wheelers, three-wheelers or dirt bikes over 50cc on Park property. Gators, mules and other ATVs are permitted.

Paddocks – Paddock rental can be made through Devers Show Services at 859-233-9702. A 24-hour notice is appreciated.

Feed and Hay – Feed and hay can be pre-ordered through Devers Show Services at 859-233-9702. A 24-hour notice is appreciated.

Dogs – All dogs must be on a leash and under the control of a handler at all times, or suitably restrained in a tack stall or similar. Local animal authorities will remove loose dogs at the owner's expense. Dogs in distress left in cars, trucks, trailers, etc. will be removed at the owner's expense.

Admission – All exhibitors are required to pay a one-time \$15 parking fee upon arrival at the Kentucky Horse Park. Exhibitors will receive an exhibitor pass that will allow them entry to the show grounds for the remainder of the horse show.

Parking/Traffic – NO PARKING is permitted in the stabling areas, arenas, on the grass or in other designated NO PARKING areas. Failure to comply will result in the vehicles and/or trailers being ticketed and towed. Once unloaded, horse trailers must be parked in the designated trailer parking areas. To get to the designated trailer lot, turn right onto Cigar Lane at the intersection of Nina Bonnie Blvd. and Cigar Lane. Turn left onto Walt Robertson Road (which will run behind the Alltech Arena). A paved lot will be on the left and signs will be posted for the Trailer Parking Area.

Fees -
