RULES, REGULATIONS & POLICIES

IMPORTANT INFORMATION: Show Management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel, limit or move classes and divisions as entries warrant, which could mean divisions may change days on which they run or rings in which they are held. Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class lists. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries or divisions, combine or cancel classes, modify the schedule, and to modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management. Changes will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form and posted in the show office. Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to, the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; their decision to be final.

TREATMENT OF HORSES: Show Management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.) Championships.

PARTICIPATING RIDER CODE OF CONDUCT: The Jockey Club (TJC) expects appropriate behavior from all riders, trainers, spectators and others participating in any TJC event, including events held in conjunction with TJC events. Inappropriate behavior may include, but is not limited to: possession, use or distribution of any illegal drugs; profanity, vulgar language or gestures; harassment (i.e., using words or actions that intimidate, threaten or persecute others before, during or following The Jockey Club activities); failure to follow rules; and abusing a horse. Reports of inappropriate code of conduct may be made at any time to the Show Manager via email, text, phone call or in-person. Any verbal or physical act of discourtesy toward a judge, show official, volunteer, show staff or TJC staff member on the part of a trainer, owner, rider, handler, groom, family member or person associated with an entry is a violation of the Code of Conduct. Persons found by Show Management to be in violation of this Code of Conduct will be unable to participate in the remainder of the show, will forfeit all fees and awards from previous classes and divisions, and will be ineligible to show at the T.I.P. Championships in 2022, and/or at events held in conjunction with T.I.P. Championships and/or T.I.P. Championships in future years.

COGGINS TEST: South Carolina state law requires that each horse be accompanied by a negative EIA certificate dated within one year.

ENTRIES: The closing date for entries is September 21, 2022. All entries online. After the closing date, all stall deposits and office fees are non-refundable. The entry form must include all mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibiting. **No late entries.**

STALLS: Permanent 12 X 12 stalls of wood/metal construction with stall mats and doors. Stalls will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. All requests to be stabled with other competitors and all special stabling requests must be included with the horse' entry and will be accommodated when possible. **All stabling requests and changes must be sent in to the Stable View email by 5:00 PM ET Tuesday, October 4 (secretary@stableviewfarm.com)**.

CHANGES: Prior to Tuesday, October 4, all scratches and changes must be sent to the show office and T.I.P. via email to: secretary@stableviewfarm.com and tjctip@jockeyclub.com. After Tuesday, October 4, all changes must be made in person at the show office.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

MOTORIZED VEHICLES/GOLF CARTS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license that allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single-wheeled scooters, is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. The parent/legal

guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle or device in violation of these rules is solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of these rules will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minor exhibitors shall hold Stable View, The Jockey Club, Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL guardian. The signature of unrelated persons WILL NOT be accepted.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: Protective headgear, properly secured, must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED, anywhere, anytime on the show grounds. All riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards; must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: All non-showing horses must complete an entry blank and be assigned a back number. A \$50 fee will be assessed to any horse not entered in any classes. Stall fee and non-refundable stall deposit applies. Non-showing horses are not permitted in competition rings at any time.

RIBBONS AND PRIZES

- In-Hand Championships: Class ribbons 1st through 10th place and prize to each class winner. Overall Championship prizes and sashes through 6th place, based on overall In-Hand Championship placement.
- Championships Divisions: Class ribbons 1st through 10th place. Prizes and sashes for Divisions through 10th place, based on division placement.

PRIZE MONEY

- In-Hand Championships: \$500 in prize money, awarded in the overall Championship only. Prize money for In-Hand Championships through 6th place, based on overall In-Hand Championship placement. (\$150, \$125, \$100, \$55, \$40, \$30).
- Championships Divisions: \$2,000 in prize money per Division with payouts based on division placement only. Prize money for Divisions through 10th place (based on division placement only) of: \$600, \$440, \$300, \$200, \$140, \$120, and \$50 each 7th through 10th place.

All prize money won at the Championships will be mailed to the winner following the event <u>upon receipt of a completed prize money request form and W-9</u>. Prize money request forms and W-9s will be included in division placement bags and will be made available on the website at <u>tjctip.com/About/CSF</u>. Mail completed prize money forms after the show to The Jockey Club T.I.P., 821 Corporate Dr., Lexington, KY 40503. Prize money checks will not be mailed without a completed form. Please allow up to 30 days for prize money forms to be processed.

HIGH POINT AWARDS

High Point AA and Junior Rider awards will be awarded in every Division except the Pleasure Divisions and In-Hand.

- a. Junior Rider riders 18 years of age and under as of January 1, 2022.
- b. AA –Adult Amateurs only. For details on what constitutes Amateur status, please visit www.usef.org.

Additional High Point awards may also be offered, including for horses adopted from TAA Accredited organizations and for RRP Thoroughbred Makeover alumni or 2022 RRP Thoroughbred Makeover entered horses.

IMPORTANT - In order to be eligible for the AA, Junior, TAA or RRP High Point awards, the status MUST be listed on the 2022 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. It is the owner or rider's responsibility to indicate a horse or rider is eligible. Failure to indicate eligibility for each High Point award (including Junior riders) on the Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form means the horse or rider will not be included in the calculation for the High Point awards.

CALCULATION OF DIVISIONS AND HIGH POINT AWARDS

Hunter/Jumper/Pleasure Division Placements and High Point calculation:

For Dressage: High Point will be based on the best single test per horse/rider combination. Division placements will be based on the average of the two tests. In case of a tie, the horse/rider with the highest single score is the winner; if the highest scores are the same, the next highest scores will be considered until the tie is broken.

For CT: High Point is given to highest placed eligible horse in each Division. Division placements will be based on the horse's placing in the CT division.

DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Failure to maintain your dog, under control, as defined here, will result in a \$100 fine assessed to the owner. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs may be removed from the show grounds at the owner's expense and impounded by animal control.

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six (6) feet wide by eight (8) feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse.

PARKING: Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles, from being parked in the stable areas. Vans and trailers will be allowed in the stable area only to load or off-load. PARKING AREAS WILL BE DESIGNATED AND VIOLATORS WILL BE TOWED AT OWNER'S EXPENSE

RING SIZES:

- All rings and warmups are sand/poly-fiber mixture
- 300 ft. x 250 ft. Covered arena (The Covered) all schooling, in hand classes
- 300 ft. x 250 ft. Outdoor arena (The Outdoor) Jumper, in-hand classes
- 220 ft. x 120 ft. Dressage arena (Silva Arena) Hunters, Pleasure
- 150 ft. x 200 ft. arena (Hunter Arena) Hunters, Pleasure
- 330 ft. x 230 ft. arena Dressage

LIABILITY: The Jockey Club, Stable View Equestrian Center, their officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant, other employees, animals, or equipment at the events. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses, or their dogs. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep that policy up to date.

PHOTO RELEASE: By signing the entry form, I agree to waive the right of use of my photos/videos at the competition and grant The Jockey Club and Stable View Equestrian Center and their agents full use of any and all competition photos and video.

ATTIRE: Proper attire please.

EQUIPMENT: No martingales permitted in flat classes. No equine wraps or bell boots of any kind permitted in hunter or in-hand classes. Braiding not required.

RULES: Classes will be conducted under current USEF rules unless otherwise noted by Show Management or in these Rules. Whips are not permitted in Dressage Championships classes. All tests may be read in all Dressage classes.

DRUGS AND MEDICATION: Current USEF rules relating to drugs and medications will be enforced.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES: Check Stable View website for up to date information.

DRESSAGE RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be posted.

AT THE FACILITY: Arenas and rings are open for schooling ONLY during posted times. Do not enter the rings or arenas outside of schooling or competition times. Riding on marked trails is permitted. Do not use the Cross Country Course or the Boyd Martin ETB Schooling Field at any time and do not ride off of marked trails.

ARRIVAL INFORMATION: Competitors can arrive anytime on Thursday, October 6. Please try to arrive while it's light - the earlier the better. Barns F-J are accessed via Gate 3 - please select a number along the tree line or fence line and reverse your rig back to it. All Day Parking is accessed via Gate 2. If you reserved a paddock in advance, all paddocks are accessed via Gate 1. Competitors are responsible for night check.

Fees:

- Entry Fee: \$200 per horse for first division; \$100 per horse for an additional division.
 - *NO extra office or grounds fees! All included in your entry fee!
 - **First Division fee also includes one entry in the In-Hand classes.
- Stabling fees:
 - o STALL WITH PADDOCK fee: \$300 per stall/paddock. [there are 38 stalls with paddocks available. First come, first serve; no additional paddocks available once paddocks are sold out].
 - o STALL fee (no paddock): \$250 per stall [there are 200 stalls available, first come, first serve].
 - Stabling fees above include competition days plus one day arrival (October 6) and one day departure (October 10). Stabling fee includes full access to all training facilities at Stable View excluding the cross country course and the Boyd Martin ETB Schooling Field.
 - A non-refundable stall deposit of \$50 is required at time of entry and will be deducted from the stall fee.
 - All stalls must be stripped at the conclusion of the event, or exhibitors will be charged a \$50 stall cleaning fee.
 - Bedding is NOT provided. To purchase shavings, contact the Stable View office <u>info@stableviewfarm.com.</u> Shavings must be ordered through the show office by September 21, 2022.
 - Hay is not available.
- Non-Competing Horses: \$50 per horse (same stall fee and non-refundable stall deposit applies). Non-competition horses not permitted in competition rings.
- Refunds: Before entries close (September 21, 2022), entries for classes will be refunded less a \$50 processing fee. After entries have closed, only upon presentation of a vet certificate pronouncing the horse unfit to show, entries for classes will be refunded less a \$50 scratch fee and the stall deposit (\$50) will not be refunded; a total of \$100 will not be refunded. Without a vet certificate pronouncing the horse unfit to show, entries for classes will not be refunded and the stall deposit (\$50) will not be refunded.
- Payment Payment is required at time of entry. Entries not paid by closing date will be charged a \$20 late fee.
- Returned check fee: \$30

GENERAL T.I.P. SPECIFICATIONS

- 1. T.I.P. Championships are open only to qualified and declared Thoroughbreds. A "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club (TJC) or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by TJC.
- 2. Each division is open only to horses that qualified and declared for that division.
 - a. **Qualifying**: To qualify for the Championships, a <u>T.I.P. eligible</u> Thoroughbred must (1) <u>participate</u> in a show offering T.I.P. High Point awards, classes or divisions beginning August 1, 2021, through August 31, 2022 (qualifying shows would include the 2021 T.I.P. Championships); or (2) participate in a Take2 division beginning August 1, 2021, through August 31, 2022; or (3) be entered in the 2022 Thoroughbred Makeover or have participated in the 2021 Mega Makeover; or (4) have participated in the 2021 T.I.P. Performance Awards; or (5) be accepted through a 2022 Hardship Request (below).
 - i. Virtual or online horse shows do not count for qualification.
 - ii. All qualifications must be in the applicable discipline. To qualify, horses can be shown in any classes or divisions at the show offering T.I.P. awards in the relevant discipline.
 - iii. Horses shown at a horse trial or combined test may also qualify for the Championships through their show jumping or dressage phase (as applicable).
 - iv. All Thoroughbreds must have a T.I.P. Number to qualify.
 - v. All qualified horses may also participate in the In-hand Championships (no separate in-hand qualification required).
 - b. **<u>Declaring</u>**: After qualifying, owners and riders must declare their horse for the Championships by submitting a Horse Declaration Form, available on the T.I.P. Website (Championships tab).
 - c. Hardship Requests: Hardship Requests to qualify for Championships will be considered ONLY for Thoroughbreds that are being shown during the Championship year, but were not able to attend a qualifying show and did not participate in the Performance Awards. To be considered for a Hardship Request qualification, a Thoroughbred must attend a MINIMUM of two (2) shows or barrel races during the Championship year and must have been shown at the height or level being requested at one of those shows. To request qualification via a Hardship Request, you must submit a completed Hardship Declaration Form including (i) a statement explaining in less than 500 words why you are not able to access shows with T.I.P. awards and (ii) a brief show record covering the Championship year, including show or barrel race name, date, division, test (if applicable), height jumped (if applicable) and any other relevant information. You must submit the Hardship Request form and statement by August 31, 2022. You will be notified if your Hardship Request for qualification has been accepted prior to the closing of entries. Incomplete forms will not be accepted. HARDSHIP REQUESTS WILL ONLY BE CONSIDERED IF THE HORSE HAS BEEN SHOWN DURING THE CHAMPIONSHIP YEAR.
 - d. You must submit the Hardship statement by August 31, 2022.
- 3. Cross-Entering: Each horse may only be entered in up to two (2) Championship Divisions total (across all disciplines). Horses must be qualified and declared for both divisions. Management reserves the right to limit, combine, split or cancel divisions. Each horse may only be entered in one in-hand class.
- 4. Cross-entering within the same discipline (Hunter, Jumper) (i) with the same rider must be at consecutive heights and (ii) with a different rider must be at consecutive heights unless a dispensation is requested via email to tictip@jockevclub.com and granted PRIOR TO THE CLOSE OF ENTRIES.
- 5. Jump Height: For jumping divisions, the horse may be entered at or above the lowest height jumped during the Championship year.
- 6. Dressage Level: For Dressage, each horse may be entered at or above the lowest level competed during the Championship year.

IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIPS SPECIFICATIONS

Horse should be presented in a bridle. Handler Attire: Traditional show attire or button-down shirt and slacks with close-toed shoes are also proper attire if a handler prefers not to wear traditional show clothes. Each horse may be entered in only one in-hand class. Entry for one (1) in-hand class included with your Championship Division entry. Will be judged on conformation and way of going at a walk and trot in hand. Minor blemishes and faults not considered. Winner of each Class #1 – #8 will be entered in the \$500 In-Hand Championship, judged after the conclusion of class #8. Large classes will be split for judging purposes – splits will be made available via email and in the show office.

- 1. War Horse In-Hand (won over \$100,000) Open to Thoroughbreds that have won over \$100,000.
- 2. War Horse In-Hand (more than 50 starts) Open to Thoroughbreds that raced over 50 times.
- 3. In-Hand 6yo and over Mares Open to Thoroughbred mares 6 years of age or older (age as of January 1, 2022)
- 4. In-Hand 2yo to 5yo Fillies/Mares Open to Thoroughbred fillies and mares 2 to 5 years of age (age as of January 1, 2022)
- 5. In-Hand 6yo and over Geldings/Stallions Open to Thoroughbred geldings and stallions 6 years of age or older (age as of January 1, 2022)
- 6. In-Hand 2yo to 5yo Geldings/Colts Open to Thoroughbred geldings and stallions 2 to 5 years of age (age as of January 1, 2022)
- 7. TAA/TCA Aftercare Organization Graduate In-Hand (Gelding) Open to Thoroughbred geldings adopted from a 2022 Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited organization (see thoroughbredaftercare.org/taa-accredited-organizations/) or a Thoroughbred Charities of America Thoroughbred Rehabilitation, Retraining, Rehoming and Retirement Grantee (see tca.org/rescue-grantees/).
- 8. TAA/TCA Aftercare Organization Graduate In-Hand (Mare) Open to Thoroughbred mares adopted from a 2022 Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance accredited organization (*see* thoroughbredaftercare.org/taa-accredited-organizations/) or a Thoroughbred Charities of America Thoroughbred Rehabilitation, Retraining, Rehoming and Retirement Grantee (*see* tca.org/rescuegrantees/).

HUNTER DIVISION SPECIFICATIONS

Each Hunter Division consists of 3 O/F classes and 1 U/S class.

- Hunter Over Fences To be shown over approximately eight fences at the required height. To be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.
- Hunter Over Fences Handy Course may include, but is not limited to, halt on course, trot fence, roll back, negotiating natural obstacles, bending line, bounce or a fence jumped in a direct line to/from the in gate. etc.
- Hunter Under Saddle To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. May be asked to hand gallop at the discretion of the judge, but no more than eight horses to gallop at one time. Martingales not permitted. Crossrails, Very Green, and Beginning Divisions will not be asked to gallop.
