WHAT IS THE THOROUGHBRED PREMIER SERIES SHOW?

After more than a decade of growth in Thoroughbred participation at horse shows across North America, The Jockey Club is taking the next step with a new pilot series of Thoroughbred-only horse shows launching in 2027.

Designed to put the spotlight squarely on the breed, these high-quality events will feature multiple disciplines at locations across the United States. The series will give Thoroughbreds their own premier stage, celebrating their athleticism, versatility, and growing impact in the sporthorse world.

WHY IS THIS SHOW A “PREVIEW”?

To celebrate the launch of the Thoroughbred Premier Show Series, the 2026 T.I.P. Championships will feature a Hunter Classic and a Jumper Classic for qualified horses, as well as standalone classes for green horses and novice riders who aren't quite ready for T.I.P. Championships yet but want to enjoy the festivities and community of the event.

There is no qualification required for the Green Horse and Novice Rider classes but we do ask that all horses and riders be declared to participate.

1. \$5,000 T.I.P. Hunter Classic (2'6" or 3'0")

- Open to horses qualified for T.I.P. Championships at or above 2'6"
- **Limited to the first 25 entries.**

NOVICE RIDER:

First two years of showing. Rider cannot cross-enter into T.I.P. Championships unless 1) the rider is qualified and 2) a dispensation for participation in a different discipline than the Novice Rider class is requested and granted (e.g., participating in Novice Rider Pleasure and Ground Poles and qualified for T.I.P. Championships in Dressage). Horse can cross-enter with a different rider in T.I.P. Championships.

GREEN HORSE:

First two years of showing the horse and the horse has not competed above 2'0" at any show. Any rider. Horse cannot cross-enter into T.I.P. Championships.

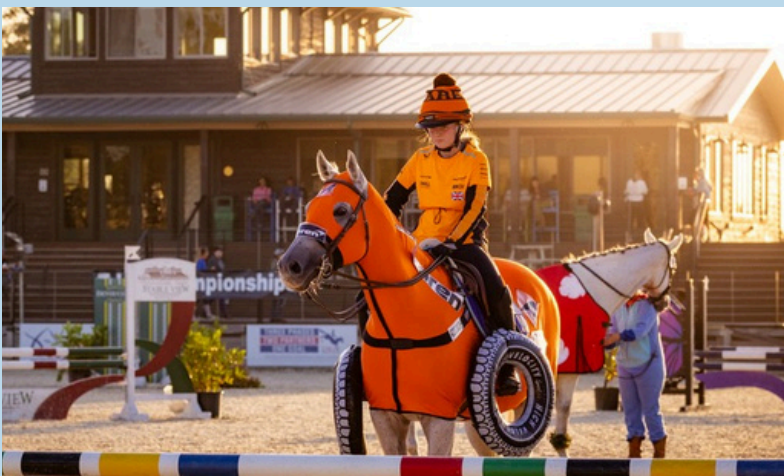

RULES, REGULATIONS & POLICIES

T.I.P. Championships will be conducted in accordance with the rules and specifications of the Thoroughbred Incentive Program Rule Book ("Rules"), available at www.tjctip.com. It is the responsibility of all trainers, owners, riders, handlers, grooms, family members or persons associated with an entry to be familiar with and comply with the Rules.

CHANGES will be posted in the Facebook event, sent via email to the email on the entry form, sent via What'sApp and posted in the show office.

COGGINS TEST: South Carolina state law requires that each horse be accompanied by a negative EIA certificate dated within one year.

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parent(s) or guardian(s) of minor exhibitors shall hold Stable View, The Jockey Club, Horse Show Management and the Facility harmless for any injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted or number issued unless entry is signed by a parent or LEGAL guardian. The signature of unrelated persons WILL NOT be accepted.

PAYMENT: Stable View reserves the right to refuse to accept an entry from any renter, owner, trainer, exhibitor or coach who has a past-due balance owed to Stable View.

TREATMENT OF HORSES: Show Management will enforce the fair and humane treatment for all horses participating in the event. Show management expects all horses to be fit to show and dismissals for unfitness or lameness at show management or the judge's discretion and are final.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: The Jockey Club and Stable View strongly encourage riders of all disciplines to wear an ASTM-approved helmet at all times while mounted. Protective headgear, properly secured, must be worn BY ALL RIDERS AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED, anywhere, anytime on the show grounds, except for adult competitors in the following three divisions can wear either an ASTM-approved helmet or may choose to wear a western hat in the competition ring only: Western Dressage, Ranch, and Western Pleasure. Mounted Competitive Trail Riders must wear a helmet in competition. In-hand Competitive Trail riders are encouraged to wear a helmet in competition. All riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times, including in all competition rings for all divisions. Headgear for all riders must meet or exceed ASTM Standards; must carry the SEI tag; and be properly secured by a harness.

DRESSAGE: WHIPS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN ANY DRESSAGE OR WESTERN DRESSAGE CLASSES. All tests may be read in all Dressage classes.

DOGS: Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Failure to maintain your dog, under control, as defined here, will result in a \$100 fine assessed to the owner. In addition, pursuant to facility regulations, loose dogs may be removed from the show grounds at the owner's expense and impounded by animal control.

ELECTRICAL/FIRE REGULATIONS: All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of 6 feet wide by 8 feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in the aisles. No Class I Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within the stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the Horse Show without recourse.

AT THE FACILITY: Arenas and rings are open for schooling ONLY during posted times. Do not enter the rings or arenas outside of schooling or competition times. Riding on marked trails is permitted. Do not use the Cross Country Course at any time and do not ride off of marked trails.

LIABILITY: The Jockey Club, Stable View Equestrian Center, their officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant, other employees, animals, or equipment at the events. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses, or their dogs. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep that policy up to date.

ENTRY INFORMATION & PROCEDURES

ENTRY PLATFORM: www.evententries.com

ENTRIES: The closing date for on-time entries is September 14, 2026. Late entries will be accepted through September 21, 2026, and subject to payment of a \$50 late fee per horse per division. All entries online. See refund policy in Fees section. The entry form must include all mandatory signatures, including legal guardian in the case of a minor exhibiting. No entries accepted after September 21, 2026.

All riders, participants and handlers in T.I.P. Championships, Premier Show Series, Fun Classes, Trail Ride and Trail Walk, and any other events must be included as riders on the entry blank and sign the Entry, Release and Indemnity Agreement.

NON-SHOWING HORSES: All non-showing horses must complete an entry blank and be assigned a back number. A \$50 fee will be assessed to any horse not entered in any classes. Stall fee applies. Non-showing horses are not permitted in competition rings at any time.

STALLS: Permanent 12 X 12 stalls of wood/metal construction with stall mats and doors. Stalls will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. All requests to be stabled with other competitors and all special stabling requests must be included with the horse's entry and will be accommodated when possible. **All stabling requests and changes must be received by Stable View via email by 5:00 PM ET Thursday, September 23 (secretary@stableviewfarm.com).**

CHANGES: All scratches, adds and changes must be sent to the show office and T.I.P. via email to: secretary@stableviewfarm.com and tjctip@jockeyclub.com. For adds and changes made September 22, 2026 or September 23, 2026, a change fee of \$25 will be charged per change or add to entry. On or after Thursday September 23, no adds or changes permitted. See Fees section.

T.I.P. CHAMPIONSHIPS are open only to qualified and declared Thoroughbreds. A "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club (TJC) or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by TJC. Each division is open only to horses that qualified and declared for that division.

Open Divisions are open to ALL RIDERS. Non-Pro Divisions are open to Junior Riders and Adult Amateur riders. It is the responsibility of the entrant to select the correct division at time of entry. No change of division can be made after September 23, 2026 absent extenuating circumstances. This includes moving from Open to Non-Pro or vice-versa.

> **CROSS-ENTERING T.I.P. CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Each horse may enter up to five (5) Championship Divisions total (all disciplines) subject to the following:

- Each horse may be entered in only one division at each height or dressage level (Open or Non-Pro); and
- Each horse may be entered in no more than 2 Dressage Divisions; and
- Each horse may be entered in no more than 2 Combined Test Divisions; and
- Each horse may be entered in only 2 jumping divisions (hunter and jumper divisions); provided, however, that if a horse has a second or third rider, then the horse may be entered with the second or third rider in one additional hunter division at or below 2'3" (for a total of three jumping divisions).
- Cross-entering within the same discipline (Hunter, Jumper) (i) with the same rider must be at consecutive heights and (ii) with a different rider must be at consecutive heights unless a dispensation is requested via email to tjctip@jockeyclub.com and granted PRIOR TO THE CLOSE OF ENTRIES.

> **CROSS-ENTERING THOROUGHBRED PREMIER SHOW SERIES & T.I.P. CHAMPIONSHIPS**

- Novice Rider – Riders entered in Novice Rider classes cannot cross-enter into T.I.P. Championships unless 1) the rider is qualified and 2) a dispensation for participation in a different discipline than the Novice Rider class is requested and granted (e.g., a rider is participating in Novice Rider Pleasure and Novice Rider Ground Poles, and has qualified for T.I.P. Championships in Dressage. The rider may cross-enter into a T.I.P. Championships Dressage Division).
- Horses entered in Novice Rider classes can cross-enter with a different rider in T.I.P. Championships.
- Green Horse - Horses entered in Green Horse classes cannot cross-enter into T.I.P. Championships.

Jump Height: For jumping Championships divisions, the horse may be entered at or above the lowest height jumped during the Championship year.

Dressage Level: For Dressage Championship divisions, each horse may be entered at or above the lowest level competed during the Championship year.

Ride Times: Ride times will be posted for dressage, western dressage, CT, competitive obstacle trail and some Novice Rider and Green Horse classes.

> RIBBONS AND PRIZES

- **In-hand Championships:** Class ribbons 1st through 10th place and prize to each class winner. Overall Championship prizes and sashes through 6th place, based on overall In-hand Championship placement.
- **Championships Divisions:** Class ribbons 1st through 10th place. Prizes and sashes for Divisions through 10th place, based on division placement.
- **Premier Series Classes:**
 - Classics: Class sashes & ribbons 1st through 10th place. Prizes through 10th place.
 - Green and Novice Classes: Class ribbons 1st through 10th place. Prize to each class winner.
- **Fun classes:** Ribbons and prizes.

> HIGH POINT AWARDS FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

- High Point Adult Amateur (AA) will be awarded in every Championship Division except the English Pleasure Divisions and In-hand.
- Junior Rider awards will be awarded in every Championship Division except the English Pleasure Divisions and In-hand.
- Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance (TAA) will be awarded to the overall high point in CT, Competitive Trail, Dressage, Hunter, Jumper, Western Dressage, Western Pleasure/Ranch,. Championship Divisions only.
- Retired Racehorse Project (RRP) will be awarded to the overall high point horse (2026 Entered, 2025 Alumni, 2024 Alumni, 2023 Alumni, 2022 & prior Alumni). For High Point awards crossing divisions, awards will be calculated based on division placing and number of horses beat.

IMPORTANT: In order to be eligible for AA, Junior, or RRP High Point awards, the status MUST be listed on the 2026 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. In order to be eligible for the TCA/TAA adoption class and TAA High Point awards, the horse's eligible adoption organization MUST be listed on the 2026 Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form. It is the owner or rider's responsibility to indicate a horse or rider is eligible for ANY of these awards. Failure to indicate eligibility for each High Point award (including Junior riders) on the Declaration Form or Hardship Request Declaration Form will result in exclusion of horse and/or rider from calculation of the High Point awards.

> OTHER AWARDS

- **Best Turned Out Horse Award:** awarded one per in-hand class. No award in overall Championship.
- **Sportmanship Award:** recognizes an equestrian who puts camaraderie and integrity above winning at the event. Up to 15 awards (ribbons) available at the awards table to be provided upon nomination and selection.
- **Helping Hand Award:** recognizes a parent, sibling, friend, volunteer, or staff member who is “caught” supporting others at the show. This person goes out of their way to lend assistance in the barn, helps riders and horses prepare for the ring, and fosters a positive and encouraging environment as a spectator, staff member or volunteer. Up to 10 awards (ribbons) available at the awards table to be provided upon nomination and selection.
